
Parishes of Harden and Wilsden

World Day of Prayer 2019 will be celebrated on Friday 1st March. This year the service has been prepared by the women of Slovenia. Our local service will be at Trinity Church, Wilsden at 2pm led by Rev. Christine Crabtree. Men and women are both welcome. On this special day those taking part are encouraged to become aware of other countries and cultures, to sympathize with their problems and to pray with and for them. They are further encouraged to recognise their own talents and use them in the service of society.

Lent 2019 Discussion groups. These will run for five weeks, from week beginning 11th March, with a final joint session at St Saviour's after the Wednesday evening service in Holy Week. The groups will follow a study guide "Lent with Luke".

There are three possible daytime slots: Monday afternoon in Harden,

Wednesday morning in St John's, or Thursday morning in Denholme (with lunch!)

Also two possible evenings: Thursday in St. John's or Wednesday in Wilsden.

If you would like to be involved and meet with members of other churches please sign the sheet at the back of church **today** indicating the times that would be possible for you.

Volunteers are also needed to act as hosts in Harden and Wilsden, not necessarily for the whole period.

Statistics and Mission Support There are a lot of statistics out there and many conflicting variations, sometimes depending on carefully defined base lines. You can look at numbers until you don't know what to think.

That is why the information Revd Liz Moy gave us in a recent sermon packed such a punch. "If you have food in the fridge, clothes on your back, a roof over your head and a place to sleep, you are richer than 75% of this world. If you have never experienced the danger of battle, the loneliness of imprisonment, the agony of torture or the pangs of starvation, you are ahead of 500 million people in the world. If you can read this information, you are more blessed than over two billion people in the world who cannot read at all." Liz's statistics contained a lot more words than numbers and I am sure a whole range of pictures came into our minds as we listened. Perhaps we reflected on the enormity of the problems and how little impact we could have.

The charities our churches have chosen to support all play their parts in different ways. We are continuing our tradition of focussing on the Church Mission Society during Lent. Our CMS partner Awais is working specifically with people who have fled from battle, torture and starvation. You can contribute by supporting the Lent Lunch on March 24th and there will also be CMS boxes available in church throughout Lent.

Unusually we are including an event for the Leprosy Mission during this season in order to take advantage of the Government pledge to double donations at this time.

Traidcraft plc was founded in 1979 and were pioneers in campaigning for guaranteed prices and improved conditions. This year marks their 40th anniversary and happily, after a restructuring, the company now looks set to continue this work.
