9pm Night Prayer




Join the growing numbers who are praying with us each day. Readings, psalms and prayers, with a little bit of Bible explanation too. If you're late you can still watch on replay too.

A MESSAGE FROM BISHOP TOBY

Dear friends and colleagues,

This comes with deep appreciation of all that you and your teams are doing in enabling our churches to open for worship. Thanks, too, for keeping me, Andy, Carmel and our Area Deans informed of your plans.

I have two urgent matters to share with you.

You will have read in an Ad Clerum from Bishop Nick about the Diocesan Appeal for Sudan that we launched this week. I am writing here to support that appeal. Please consider sharing this need with your congregation. Further information on how to give, and a short video can be found [here](#).

You may want to use the following quote from me:

"The need in Sudan is urgent and severe. Without state aid, people from the most disadvantaged communities, which includes most Christians, have either to work where they can, risking COVID-19 with no health care facilities, or face starvation. All western aid agencies were thrown out of the country by the previous government so that our diocesan link with the Episcopal Church is one of a very few channels of external support.

I know that many Christians and churches in the Bradford area, as well as many others in our communities; have taken a strong financial hit as a result of the COVID-19 lockdown. But I also meet some church members who tell me that their finances are in better shape because they have been spending less. So acknowledging the different situations that we are in and that some may not be able to give financially, may I urge you nevertheless, with me, to prayerfully and urgently consider your giving, and especially a gift to the Sudan Appeal."

I am also asking for prayer for Bradford at this time as COVID infection levels are rising. Please pray for the leaders and people of the city and our district as we look forward to hot, sunny weather tomorrow and as our Muslim neighbours celebrate Eid this weekend. We all need wisdom as we walk a fine line between a right encouraging of our local economies and a right caution with regard to a dangerous virus that continues to spread.

I continue to thank God for you and your leadership, and to pray for you at this challenging time. I trust that you will find time to rest over the coming weeks!
