Sun 22 nd	On Homelessness Sunday pray for the men who slept at St Matthew's and for others that the Inn Churches programme wasn't able to help. Pray that our society may change in ways that reduce the causes of such need.
Mon 23 rd	Pray for the work of CMS, for mission partner Awais and her work with asylum seekers in the Bradford and Leeds area.
Tues 24th	Pray for CMS partners who cannot be identified for safety reasons, including some in the Middle East working on Bible translation into local languages.
Wed 25 th	Pray for those helping with hospitality for the Alpha course and give thanks for the good response to the request for helpers.
