**Lent 2018** Outline plans have been agreed for Churches Together study groups, running for six weeks, from week beginning 12<sup>th</sup> February. Sign-up sheets will be available shortly.

Two main options will be available.

1. Denholme Shared Church will be the venue for a JSP (Jesus Shaped People) course on Thursday mornings. This will look at the prayer life of Jesus with a special focus on the Lord's Prayer, closing with a soup and bread-roll lunch. If there is sufficient interest an evening session is also possible. Members of the other churches will be most welcome but advance booking will be essential for catering purposes.

2. The alternative study is *Finding a Voice: a Lent Course based on the film 'The King's Speech'*. This has already been trialled successfully by Rev. Christine Crabtree. The film will be used as a trigger for discussion of what the Bible has to say on many universal issues. Four parallel groups are planned:
