## Gift Aid Small Donations Scheme

A reminder about how **non-taxpayers** can use the GASDS to augment their church giving.

However, for those people who don't pay tax, the following points may be useful:-

- The GASDS allows the church to claim back from the taxman an extra 25 pence for every £1 given.
- The Gift Aid Secretary can only do this for cash gifts of £30 or less made during a church service (this has increased from £20 from April 2019)
- For cash gifts of £30 or less in an envelope the extra money can be claimed.
- If that same cash gift of more than £30 is placed on the collection plate NOT in an envelope – the extra money can be claimed. The GA Secretary does not know that the money is a single gift, and is entitled to assume it is several gifts of less than £30.
- For cheque and standing order donations the extra money cannot be claimed back. It is better to place cash on the plate, or in an envelope if £30 or less.

### All of the above only applies to non-taxpayers.

People who do pay tax are urged to sign a Gift Aid Declaration that enables the Gift Aid Secretary to claim back 25 pence for every £1, no matter how the gift is made or whatever the amount of the gift.

**Fantasy Football** - Revd Richard Burge is starting a Benefice League of fantasy football. The game is easy to play. The rules are very simple:

- Ten points for a win in the FA Cup, five points for a drawn game
