Wilsden Living Advent Calendar 2019 During Advent until Christmas, a decorated window will 'open' each evening at a new address as part of Wilsden's 'Living Advent Calendar'. They will stay lit until Twelfth Night (6th January) Pick up a programme in church or from the St. Matthew's web-site.

The Leprosy Mission can sell used stamps to help support their work. Please bring your used stamps to put in the box in each church. (leave a border of about 1/2 cm or 1/4 inch around the stamp) Stamps of all kinds, foreign and GB, even the most ordinary can be used. A recent letter said, "a gift of stamps has given hope, bringing light into darkness and demonstrating that people affected by leprosy are not forgotten."

Music at Christmas Last Tuesday singers from Churches Together presented a short service of carols, prayers, and a reading to the residents of Laurel Bank with Judith Bryan starring on the piano.

On Thursday, the New Inn in Wilsden was crowded for the annual Carols in the Pub. Churches and community joined together to sing the old favourites and to raise money for Inn Churches. Peter Mann was in his element as a pub organist. One group, keen to sing "Five gold rings", donated £51 for the privilege. A total of £200 was raised for our shelter. The Christmas quiz was popular, if obscure. Did you know that the largest Christmas cracker in the world was pulled by 1478 people? Do you care? The quality of singing improved dramatically on Saturday morning when a scratch choir from Trinity and St. Matthew's met in Stephen Smith's. Led by Sue Mitchell, they sang carols in what, after more than 20 years, has become a Wilsden tradition.

This evening we will worship God in song at our Carol Services.
