The Inn Churches Night Shelter The church, the guests, and the volunteers are all still standing so it went well. The first three nights were quiet but the last was more exciting, with two problems, including a medical one. The volunteers coped magnificently, as we have come to expect, but we are not used to having flashing blue lights outside the church. Once was enough!

After a full house last year, the numbers this time never reached double figures and some volunteers were disappointed. Paul Bointon from Inn Churches tells me that numbers in the first month of the shelter season have been rather low, mostly because the parent charity carefully screens the guests to ensure that volunteers can cope with them. We need to remember that every single guest given hospitality for the night is someone who would otherwise sleep on the streets.

So a huge thank you to the more than 70 volunteers who cooked, cleaned and cared. Without you, it would not have happened.

The shelter continues in other churches until the end of March. Please keep those churches and the guests in your prayers.
