If you have a pretend candle that would be even better.


Light it and put it in a window at 8.30pm for half an hour each night.

**Neighbourhood Support Services** To help with these difficult times of self isolation and social distancing Bradford Council have set up a Neighbourhood Support Service and have identified, and are supporting, points of contact in our villages.

Everyone in our community is asked to keep an eye on their neighbours (from a distance), particularly those without internet access. If they need help then let them know about the service or the service know about them.

**VE DAY 8 May** This coming Friday is the special Bank Holiday to mark 75 years since VE day. Sadly all the planned commemorations will not be taking place. There will be two minutes silence at 11am. If you are able to go to your doorsteps or stand at your window for that time it will help everyone to remember. In the afternoon we are encouraged to hold a 1940's style Tea Party in our homes! At 9pm the Queen will address the nation and then we are encouraged to go to our doorsteps for a national rendition of "We'll meet again!"

**Our Local Food Banks** are playing a vital role during the present crisis. Many people are not working and are in financial difficulties. The Bingley Food Bank, which we traditionally support, has continued at its usual level although with some difficulty due to social distancing. In contrast, the central Bradford food banks are facing a huge increase in demand for their services and need our help. If you would like to contribute food items then in Harden these may be left on the doorstep at the Raine's home and in Wilsden at the Post Office. These will be forwarded to the Bradford Metropolitan Food bank, a local charity. However, financial contributions, especially with Gift Aid, would be particularly welcome. This allows the charity to buy the goods it needs at wholesale prices. The Bradford Metropolitan Food Bank's web-site has a donations page with a Gift Aid option.

**The Daily Hope Phone Line** is a new development from the Church of England. For those who struggle to use online resources the church has now set up a free phone line called ‘Daily Hope.’

You can call it at any time, day or night on 0800 804 8044.

The whole system is pre-recorded so is always available.

The first thing you will hear will be the Archbishop of Canterbury welcoming you. You can listen to his whole message or move on through the options.

Option 1 takes you to Hymns We Love. This is a short 20 minute service based round a well-known hymn.

Option 2 takes you to Hymn line where you can listen to hymns.

Option 3 takes you to prayer line for a variety of prayers.

Option 4 gives you more options. (but I haven’t explored that yet!).
