


The Benefice of Harden, Wilsden, Cullingworth, Denholme

You are the King of Glory,


You are the Prince of Peace,

First Reading: Acts 1: 6-14

So when they had come together, they asked him, 'Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know the times or periods




that the Father has set by his own authority. But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.' When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. While he was going and they were gazing up towards heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. They said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up towards heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven.'

Then they returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When they had entered the city, they went to the room upstairs where they were staying, Peter, and John, and James, and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these were constantly devoting themselves to prayer, together with certain women, including Mary the mother of Jesus, as well as his brothers.

Second Reading: John 17:1-11

After Jesus had spoken these words, he looked up to heaven and said, 'Father, the hour has come; glorify your Son so that the Son may glorify you, since you have given him authority over all people, to give eternal life to all whom



you have given him. And this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent. I glorified you on earth by finishing the work that you gave me to do. So now, Father, glorify me in your own presence with the glory that I had in your presence before the world existed.

'I have made your name known to those whom you gave me from the world. They were yours, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you have given me is from you; for the words that you gave to me I have given to them, and they have received them and know in truth that I came from you; and they have believed that you sent me. I am asking on their behalf; I am not asking on behalf of the world, but on behalf of those whom you gave me, because they are yours. All mine are yours, and yours are mine; and I have been glorified in them. And now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one.

In the reading from Acts we hear Jesus' last words to the disciples:

"You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

They would have had no idea what he meant when he talked about the Holy Spirit, but they would soon find out when the day of Pentecost came a week later. Although I am sure that the promise of the Holy Spirit was overshadowed for them by the second part of the sentence.

"You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

Every phrase here must have filled them with dread! Here were a group of eleven men who were still barricading themselves inside locked rooms for fear of the people outside.

As amazing as the resurrection had been for them, they must have felt more than ever like the group of fishermen and tax collectors that they really were. Surely, they believed that now Jesus had risen from the dead, overcoming the crucifixion by the Romans, <u>he</u> would lead them to glory. But his words were:

"You will be my witnesses ..." Surely there must be some mistake.

And there was more to come in this bombshell when they heard the places, he was sending them.

Jerusalem: Well that was difficult, these were the ones they were hiding from! Judea: Well for eleven men this was somewhat impossible! Samaria: Now Jesus was talking the unthinkable - everyone avoided Samaria!

As they were taking in the impossible task that Jesus was setting them, they must have been even more bemused and distraught that he then rose out of their midst leaving them all alone to face it. It is no surprise that they all stood there looking into the sky, probably with their mouths gaping open at those famous last words!

Jesus said to them: you take my message to the difficult, the impossible and the unthinkable! It must have really felt like Mission Impossible!

And the mission of course wasn't just for those disciples. It is the same mission that we are called to today.

Just because our church buildings are closed doesn't take away our call to bring people to know Jesus. Now, more than ever, people need to know his message of hope, love and peace.

So, you could:

And who might be the people you could share the good news with? Don't just think of the easy ones! Who is difficult, who is impossible, who is unthinkable? Thinking about this task of mission can leave us feeling quite unfit to meet it. And I am sure that is how the disciples felt too.

But Jesus had not left them, he sent his Spirit so that he was still with them. The task was not something that they had to do alone, but Jesus went before them, as he goes before us too.

Let us pray that our hearts may be prepared to receive afresh the gift of the Holy Spirit to give us courage to meet the task Jesus has set. May the Spirit enable us to make and find opportunities to bring to others the Good News of Jesus that we value so much. And may the Spirit give us courage to share this Good News, even with the unthinkable!

And we draw all of our prayers together in the words of the Lord's Prayer.


Our Father in heaven,
