Reflection by Janice

When I realised that I would be doing the reflection for this service, arguably the second most popular service of the year, I decided to do a straw poll amongst friends and family asking what they understood by the word "Harvest". Responses included "To gather in"; "bounty"; "collect and share"; "Festival"; "something about the gathering in of the fruits of your labour" and "collecting human organs" ... yes, I was surprised by that one as well but more about that later.

This year, with the food shortages experienced in the early days of lockdown, we were reminded how fragile the supply chain can be. Some people became aware, maybe for the first time, of the vital role our farmers play in feeding us. With a marked increase in home cooking, baking and the growing fruit and vegetables for the first time there seems to be an increased knowledge and appreciation of the food we eat and where it has come from.

To me, Harvest Festivals have always been celebrations and a reminder for us to be grateful to the Creator God and all those who work so hard to enable us to have food on the table. However, we also need to remind ourselves of those who suffer from poverty and malnutrition (and there are those who live far closer to our comfortable homes than you may imagine) and those whose lives are a daily challenge to survive.

There seems no end to the indignities suffered by some and, going back to the beginning of this reflection, the barbaric act of forced organ harvesting. Among those killed, it has been alleged, are members of religious minorities. This isn't

the time to go into any further detail but I am grateful to the individual who supplied that unexpected definition of Harvest and raising my awareness. Sometimes we need to be shocked into realising just what dire circumstances exist in the world and maybe pulling ourselves out of a rose tinted nostalgia. So ... going back to another friend's definition of Harvest; what do we, as individuals, do about our own "... gathering in of the fruits of your labour" and I don't mean in a physical sense. We need the physical bread to nourish our bodies but we can't create a harvest in our spiritual lives without getting back to the basics. Jesus declared "I am the bread of life ...".

The Fruits of the Spirit set out in Paul's letter to the Galatians - love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control need cultivating, just like crops in the fields. If not they will wither and die and at a time when the world is crying out for those fruits of the Spirit let's do everything we can to make sure that when we gather in the fruits of our labour we have a bumper Harvest!

May we all be blessed with an awareness and knowledge of the living Lord Jesus Christ through his Holy Spirit. Amen
